ATLANTA, Georgia -- **North Fulton Community Charities (NFCC) and Catamount Constructors, Inc. NFCC's mission is to prevent homelessness in North Fulton by supporting families in their homes during short-term emergencies. By pooling the resources of local religious, business and civic groups and individuals, NFCC assists families with rent, utilities, transportation, food, clothing, medicine and other basic needs. During 2006 North Fulton Community Charities provided assistance to 4,150 local families.

"Catamount's continued commitment to North Fulton Community Charities makes a tremendous difference in our ability to accomplish our mission," said Barbara Duffy, NFCC's Executive Director since 1990. "Our staff, volunteers and Board of Directors extend our gratitude to Catamount for helping us preserve dignity and hope within the North Fulton community," Duffy added. "There are numerous health and safety problems with Miss Sarah's house and she is very excited about the idea that her home will again be secure and protected from the elements," Duffy concluded.

Founded in 1997 with offices in Atlanta, Georgia and Denver, Colorado, Catamount is a privately held general contractor providing contracting services to owners and developers across the United States. Markets served include retail, commercial, industrial, religious, automotive, multi-family and hospitality.
