C3 Awarded US Fish & Wildlife Service Contract

DENVER, Colorado – C3, LLC, a privately held joint venture between MCC Construction Corporation (MCC), Catamount Constructors, Inc. (Catamount) and CTA Architects Engineers (CTA), has been awarded a \$400,000,000, five year multiple award task order contracting (MATOC) design-build contract for the western United States by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS), located in Arlington, Virginia. The contract, which is one of six awarded nationwide, can also be used by other Department of Interior Agencies including the National Park Service, the U.S. Geological Survey, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, the Bureau of Land Management, the Bureau of Reclamation, the Minerals Management Service and the Office of Surface Mining. Currently, MCC, Catamount and CTA are collectively working on nine additional government projects nationwide.

USFWS is a bureau within the Department of the Interior with the mission to conserve, protect and enhance fish, wildlife and plants and their habitats for the continuing benefit of the American people. Their objectives are threefold; to assist in the development and application of environmental stewardship ethics based on ecological principles, scientific knowledge of fish and wildlife and a sense of moral responsibility; guide the conservation, development and management of the Nation's fish and wildlife resources; and administer a national program to provide the public opportunities to understand, appreciate and wisely use fish and wildlife resources.

“This joint venture has presented the opportunity to join forces with two stalwart companies with impressive success stories,” said Norm Kaus, MCC President. “Collectively, we feel extremely privileged to be awarded this particular MATOC and look forward to begin working for USFWS as they continue their good works with the development and application of environmental stewardship ethics across the country,” Kaus added.

MCC, founded in 1984 and located in Greenwood Village, Colorado, is a construction management firm specializing in IDIQ contracts for new construction, design-build delivery, repair, renovation, and restoration projects at U.S. Government and other facilities nationwide.
